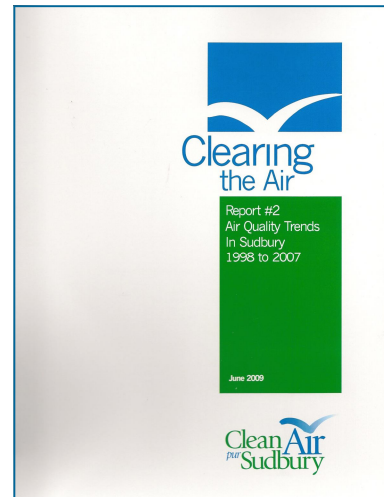

New “Clearing the Air” Report Good News for Sudbury!

Sudbury’s air quality has improved considerably since the early days of our mining history. Our latest report, “Air Quality Trends in Sudbury: 1998-2007” summarizes recent trends in Greater Sudbury’s air quality. Here are some highlights:

- Sulphur dioxide emissions from smelters have been reduced by 93% since 1960.
- According to the Ministry of the Environment station on Ramsey Lake Road, air quality in Greater Sudbury was good or very good 94% of the time between 1998 and 2007.
- Sudbury’s current air quality is better than Toronto, Hamilton or Windsor and comparable to other cities in northern Ontario.
- Air concentrations of metals, including nickel, copper and lead, have decreased.
